COMMON COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF DE PERE, WISCONSIN - May 6, 2008

The Common Council of the City of De Pere, Wisconsin, met in regular session at the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, May 6, 2008.

Mayor Walsh called the meeting to order at 7:36 pm. Roll call was taken and the following members were present: Alderpersons James Boyd, Carl Castelic, Michael Donovan, Bob Heuvelmans, Paul Kegel, Dan Robinson, and Kathy Van Vonderen. Alderperson Bob Wilmet was excused. The Opening Prayer was given by Alderperson Robinson and followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Alderperson Kegel moved, seconded by Alderperson Robinson, to approve the minutes of the April 15, 2008 Council meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING

4. A Public Hearing to act on a Precise Implementation Plan Amendment request on Parcel WD-646 (former St. Boniface Facility) located at 405 Grant Street, petitioner - Ron Van Den Heuvel is scheduled for 7:35 p.m. The Notice of Public Hearing was published in the City's Official Newspaper, the De Pere Journal on April 17 & 24, 2008. Planning Director Ken Pabich stated the Plan Commission recommended approval of the vacation subject to listed conditions.

Mayor Walsh declared the public hearing open for anyone wishing to speak.

Kevin Kay, 2447 Clear Brook, Village of Howard, stated they are excited this is happening in De Pere and wish they had something like that.

Addison Kay, 2447 Clear Brook, Village of Howard, asked that this plan be approved. She stated this will be a great school from kindergarten through 8th grade and she will be able to go to school with her little brother.

Barbara Tennity, 1365 Fox River Dr, stated she is on the Board for the Wisconsin International School. They will be meeting with St. Norbert College tomorrow and is sure the parking and alley will be on the agenda. They are looking forward to being in De Pere and they have a lot of families excited about the school.

There was no one else present who wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Ordinance #08-09 Amending Precise Implementation Plan (WD-646 for Wisconsin International School) was presented. Alderperson Heuvelmans moved, seconded by Alderperson Kegel, to enact the ordinance.

Alderperson Kegel moved, seconded by Alderperson Van Vonderen, to open the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

Ron Van Den Heuvel, 2303 Lost Dauphin Rd, responded to Alderperson Kegel's questions on the boilers at the facility. The boilers are older and one was replaced. He noted there is a new heating system in the gym. The boiler capacity will eventually need to be increased when the second floor is used. A complete air conditioning system and fire and sprinkler system were put in three years ago. Both boilers are pressure tested and in pretty good shape and he has no concerns.

Alderperson Robinson moved, seconded by Alderperson Castelic, to close the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

Upon discussion and vote, Ordinance was enacted on a unanimous vote.

5. A Public Hearing to act on the Precise Implementation Plan Amendment request and site plan approval on Parcel ED-2738 located at CTH "PP", petitioner - Keith Garrot is scheduled for 7:35 p.m. The Notice of Public Hearing was published in the City's Official Newspaper, the De Pere Journal on April 17 & 24, 2008. Planning Director Ken Pabich stated the Plan Commission recommended approval to Amend the General Development Plan subject to listed conditions.

Mayor Walsh declared the public hearing open for anyone wishing to speak.

Steve Rieda, Mau & Associates Land Surveying Company, pointed out the developer had six years ago set up a business use with no interest in it over the years. It was determined that multi-family was the only other use for this property.

There was no one else present who wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Ordinance #08-10 Amending General Development Plan (Parcel ED-2738 located on CTH PP) was presented. Alderperson Robinson moved, seconded by Alderperson Boyd, to enact the ordinance. Upon discussion and vote, motion carried unanimously.

Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Boyd, to approve the Precise Implementation Plan for an apartment complex on Parcel ED-2738 located at CTH "PP", petitioner - Keith Garot. Upon discussion and vote, motion carried with 6 ayes and 1 nay. Alderperson Van Vonderen voted nay; all others voted aye.

6. <u>Public Comment or other Announcements:</u> Mayor Walsh asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak during public comment at 8:15 p.m.

Gene Hackbarth, 933 Oakdale Ave, stated the De Pere Historic Preservation Commission needs assistance to restore and reuse the De Pere Lockkeeper's House located on Government Island. They are working on two grant applications and a successful Preserve America Grant Application requires Common Council support in the form of a resolution and provided a sample resolution for consideration at the May 20th meeting.

There was no one else present who wished to speak and Mayor Walsh closed public comment at 7:43 pm.

Alderperson Van Vonderen thanked all the third grade students at Our Lady of Lourdes for taking an interest in learning more about government.

Alderperson Castelic announced the Historic Preservation District Walks is May 24 with one walking tour at 11:00 am and a second one at 1:00 pm leaving from the White Pillars Museum. Also, on May 24-26, Celebrate De Pere will be taking place at Voyageur Park and invited everyone to attend. The gates are open from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm.

7. Sue Smullen, 706 N. Winnebago, reported on the Beautification Committee's activities. They have been in existence for over six years and have made it part of their program to add to the landscaping in different areas of the City. They do so by fundraising with the "Grow with the City of De Pere Campaign". She thanked those who gave to the campaign and the opportunity exists to do so again this year. She thanked the City for giving them funds this year, which made it possible for them to undertake the "Adopt a Pot" with eight sites in the downtown high traffic areas. They are looking at adding a water source at Bicentennial Park to aid them in watering plantings. The other project this year is for City Hall and they are working on redoing the plans. There will be a planting going into the new Clock Tower bed and noted they are planning a poinsettia sale in November for the businesses.

15. The Council discussed amending Section 85-5 De Pere Municipal Code to allow the use of "shock collar" control over an animal (dog) at large. Alderperson Kegel asked to have a discussion on the shock collar matter in response to a constituent's request.

Alderperson Kegel moved, seconded by Alderperson Van Vonderen, to open the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

Gary Brice, 143 Desplaine Rd, asked the Council to consider a shock collar as an acceptable restraint in place of the leash. He stated the shock collar works great and he has had his dog for five years with no problem. He didn't know there was an ordinance requiring dogs on a leash until the police had stopped him. Discussion followed.

Alderperson Castelic moved, seconded by Alderperson Robinson, to close the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

Alderperson Kegel moved, seconded by Alderperson Donovan, to send this matter to the Health Department for review and obtain additional information. Upon vote, motion carried with 6 ayes and 1 nay. Alderperson Castelic voted nay; all others voted aye.

16. The Council discussed the status of Eco Fiber's utility bill delinquency. Administrator Delo provided background information on the outstanding balance and the ongoing process of the sale of the facility and noted with the sale it would require a clear title. There is a total of \$509,414.49 due the City not on the tax roll.

Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Robinson, to open the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

Ron Van Den Heuvel, 2303 Lost Dauphin, reported they are about \$75 million short on their project. He has owned the facility since 1997 and the project is very close to a commitment letter. He believes this is very beneficial to the city and community. He is not giving up and he will get the utilities paid. He also stated he plans to be current with the taxes and city utilities by August 29th. He also answered alderpersons' questions.

Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Castelic, to close the meeting. Discussion followed.

Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Castelic, to approve the payment plan for Eco-Fibre. Upon discussion and vote, motion carried unanimously.

- 9. Ordinance #08-07 Repealing and Recreating Sections 58-3 through 58-11 De Pere Municipal Code Regarding Fire Prevention was presented. Alderperson Van Vonderen moved, seconded by

Alderperson Robinson, to enact the ordinance. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.

- 10. Resolution #08-47 Authorizing Consent to Assignment of Revocable Occupancy Permit was presented. Alderperson Van Vonderen moved, seconded by Alderperson Kegel, to approve the resolution. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.
- 11. Resolution #08-48 Authorizing Agreement Regarding the Sale and Purchase of Certain Property Between the City of De Pere and Machine Technologies, LLC was presented. Alderperson Kegel moved, seconded by Alderperson Boyd, to approve the resolution. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously.
- 12. Resolution #08-49 Authorizing Lease with Fox River Navigational System Authority (FRNSA for the Riverwalk and Wildlife Viewing Pier Project) was presented. Alderperson Kegel moved, seconded by Alderperson Van Vonderen, to approve the resolution. Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.
- 13. Alderperson Robinson moved, seconded by Alderperson Castelic, to approve traffic study proposal submitted by Ayres Associates for the West Side Business Park. Upon discussion and vote, motion carried unanimously.
- 14. Alderperson Van Vonderen moved, seconded by Alderperson Boyd, to refer to the Plan Commission five applications for rezoning as follows: A) WD-104 and WD-100-4, petitioner LFT Investment, LLC Larry Fisette; B) ED-808, ED-809 and ED-810, petitioner Matt Greely; C) ED-811 and ED-812, petitioner Matt Greely; D) ED-806 and ED-807, petitioner City of De Pere; and E) ED-804, petitioner City of De Pere.
