COVID-19 Update: Fifth & Sixth Confirmed Case in Brown County

BROWN COUNTY, WI— Brown County Public Health, De Pere Health Department and Oneida Nation Health Department announced today that we have two more confirmed cases of Coronavirus (COVID-19) in Brown County. This brings the total number of confirmed cases in Brown County to six.

Our health departments are actively monitoring the progression of this outbreak in Brown County. The only tool we have to slow the spread of this virus in our community is physical separation from each other. Public Health urges the community to continue to practice social distancing and stay at home. We are continuing to work closely with Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to track this situation and take the necessary steps to keep our communities safe and well.
